Mali: PWCB¹ Education 2014-2016

A Divided Education System

Education systems in Mali experienced a devastating blow in 2012 when political conflict used up the resources required to provide children with an education. There was less foreign aid and less support for the well-being of people who were already struggling against extreme poverty, low life expectancy and high levels of adult illiteracy. The result was a severe lack of school facilities, teachers, learning tools, clean water and latrines.

World Vision is providing access to education and protection for girls and boys to meet the needs of 42,135 primary level students.

World Vision Restoring Primary Schools in Mali:

This project will provide access to quality education for children who have been displaced by the conflict and also provide and equip them with:

- Safe drinking water
- Better personal hygiene
- Improved sanitation
- Provision of new classrooms and refurbished schools with latrines that are adapted for boys, girls and those with limited mobility
- The training and capacity building of teachers, mothers and members of the school management committee
